

CITING SOURCES IN MLA STYLE (5th edition)

All sources quoted directly or paraphrased in a paper must be fully identified on a separate page placed at the end of the paper. This page is titled **Works Cited** (centered one inch from the top of page). The sources that were cited in the parenthetical acknowledgements are more fully identified, arranged alphabetically according to the first word listed in the parenthetical acknowledgement. The titles of the sources may be underlined or italicized. The Works Cited list should also be double-spaced.
